Lora Reynolds Gallery is pleased to announce our first solo exhibition with New York-based artist Noriko Ambe, curated by Glenn Fuhrman.

This exhibition is the result of an ongoing dialogue between Noriko Ambe and Glenn Fuhrman. In 2008 Fuhrman commissioned Ambe to create two works for an exhibition at The FLAG Art Foundation, which was in homage to the artist Ed Ruscha. These commissioned works were the impetus that led both artist and collector to choose a selection of books for this current body of works or "collaborations" with artist's monographs.

Each of the twenty pieces in the show was carefully selected based on Ambe's admiration and intrigue with the particular artist. As she immersed herself into each monograph, studying the pages, the compositions unfolded and the process of meticulously cutting each page by hand begun.

As Lilly Wei has written in the exhibition's accompanying catalogue "[Noriko] wanted to establish an intimate bond with these artists, to comprehend their intentions and motivations - in essence, "to be them" - working with them through the assimilation of their art, without the need to be personal."

Noriko Ambe was born in Saitama, Japan in 1967. She currently lives and works in New York. Her work has been exhibited internationally and is in many collections including the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York. In 2007 she was the recipient of the Pollock-Krasner Foundation Grant.

Glenn Fuhrman is a frequent visitor to Austin and a current resident of New York City. He has been collecting contemporary art for over 20 years

A fully illustrated catalogue will be published in conjunction with the exhibition. This exhibition will travel to The FLAG Art Foundation in New York City in 2010.
